Saint Lawrence O'Toole Church

Overview

St. Lawrence O'Toole Church is the oldest Catholic church in Ironton, Ohio. Its construction was finished in 1892 by Irish immigrants who worked on the railroads in and around Ironton. Our beautiful building currently needs restoration.

Goals

Our goal is to raise \$500,000 to meet the needs of our parish. This money will be used for the necessary exterior work to St. Lawrence O'Toole Church.

Any remaining funds will allow continuation of Parish needs, including but not limited to:

- Cleaning and overall refresh of interior.
- The convent on the St. Lawrence property needs new gutters and plumbing, among other work. (This building currently houses the Parish School of Religion.)
- The stained glass windows may need to be restored within the next 10 years.
- Painting and new carpeting in the sanctuary.

Fr Peter's Sunday Reflection

Today the Holy Mother Church celebrates the wonderful gifts of God to the world – the Body and Blood of his only Son Jesus Christ who is really present under the species of bread and wine in the Holy Eucharist. The Catechism of the Catholic Church 1364 holds that “when the church celebrates the Eucharist, the sacrifice Christ offered for us on the cross remains ever present. The sacrificial character of the Eucharist is manifested in the very words of the institution from Christ “This is my body which is given for you and this cup which is poured out for you is the New Covenant in my Blood” Luke 22:9-20.

The Eucharist has various names in which it can be called like the sacrifice of Mass, the Lord's supper, the breaking of bread, memorial of the Lord's passion, the Holy Mass, and the Eucharistic assembly. The code of Canon Law defines the Eucharist, “the Eucharistic celebration is the action of Christ himself and the Church. In it, Christ the Lord, through the ministry of the priest, offers himself, substantially present under the species of bread and wine to the Father and gives himself as spiritual food to the faithful united with his offering” Canon 899.

The Body and Blood of Christ nourishes our soul, prepares and preserves it for eternity. The Eucharist is the food that God has providentially made available to us in order to nourish us on our spiritual journey. So, what material food produces in our bodily life, Holy Communion wonderfully achieves in our spiritual life. It preserves, increases and renews the life of grace we received at baptism. That was why St. Cyril of Jerusalem wrote as a father of the Church that we should Stop considering the bread and wine to be ordinary, for they are body and blood according to the Lord who made the declaration. For even if your senses suggest this to you, let faith confirm you. Do not judge this by taste but be informed without doubt from faith that you have been made worthy of the body and blood of Christ.

The Eucharist is one of the ways through which God's abiding presence continues to be with us. What this means therefore is that whenever we eat this food of the Eucharist worthily, we welcome God's presence, and He remains with us and nourishes us. However, St. Paul warned us in 1 Corinthians 11: 23-30 that whoever eats and drinks the body and blood of Christ unworthily shall be liable for the body and blood of the Lord. Therefore, we should examine ourselves before we approach the altar. For it is on account of this that some are made weak and sick while others have fallen asleep.

My brothers and sisters let us bear in mind that in the Eucharistic celebration, people, communities, races, and nations are united as they share in the Body and Blood of Christ. Christ unites us to the church in heaven. Heaven and earth meet in the Eucharistic celebrations and those already in heaven, Mary mother of God, the angels and the saints pray with us.

Dear friends, let us always have the hunger to receive Jesus in the blessed sacrament. The constant reception of the Eucharist will reduce and end the longing for sins of the flesh. Let us make out time to visit Jesus in the blessed sacrament. My brothers and sisters, let us adore forever Jesus in the Most Holy Sacrament of the altar. Amen.

THE GOSPEL READING

The Twelve

The Twelve are a core group of male disciples Jesus chose to symbolize the new Israel he is forming. A crowd has formed partly in response to their successful mission (9:1-6,10). As this community around Jesus grows, it will need to be taken care of. The Twelve help Jesus tend to the crowd, but in the process they continue learning how to depend on him rather than on material resources.

The passage subtly recalls Luke's story of the call of Simon Peter (5:1f). At Jesus' command Simon cast his net and caught an abundance of fish. Jesus then told him he would “catch men.” Now that Simon and the other disciples have begun to catch men, they help feed them.

Jewish & Catholic eucharists

Every Jew was supposed to pray before eating. Jesus' action of taking the bread and fish, saying a blessing, breaking the food, and distributing it is a basic Jewish ritual. Our eucharistic celebration is based on this liturgical action. Our prayers, however, are based on what God has done for us in and through Jesus.

Meaningful numbers

There's no obvious significance to the number of loaves and fish. The twelve baskets represent the twelve disciples whom Jesus specially chose from among his other followers. As the Twelve continue the mission of Jesus (as told in *The Acts of the Apostles*), Jesus will continue to sustain them.

God provides

When Jesus feeds the crowd, he evokes the stories of God giving manna to the Israelites in the desert and Elisha feeding 100 men with only 20 loaves (2 Kings 4:42f). These and other biblical passages point ahead to the fulfillment of God's promise of a huge, unending banquet.

God's promise was first made to people who lived in unstable times and without the luxury of local grocery stores. An endless supply of food and the joy of lasting fellowship was heaven on earth. When Jesus fed the crowd, he both fulfilled God's promise of food and gave people a foretaste of the banquet that is to come.
